Scientific Convention on Homoeopathy - South Zone 2023

Call for Abstract submission

Abstracts are invited for the Scientific Convention on Homoeopathy - South Zone 2023 to be held on 17-18, November 2023 at Mannam Memorial NSS Convention Centre, Changanassery, Kerala. The South Zone Scientific Convention is organised by the National Homoeopathy Research Institute in Mental Health under the aegis of the Central Council for Research in Homoeopathy, Ministry of Ayush, Govt. of India.

The last date for abstract submission is 5th November 2023.

Clinical Interventional, Observational research studies and evidence-based case reports will be given preference.

Case reports/ case series should preferably be of rare diseases or disease conditions in which the role of Homoeopathy is relatively higher in cure/palliation rates. Published case reports or Research studies will be considered subject to the condition that they have not been presented at any conferences before. Only original work by the authors should be presented. In the case of multiple authors, the responsibility of taking NOC from all authors will be that of the presenting author. Only registered delegates will be permitted to present the study.

Guidelines for case report/case series

All cases are expected to be reported with appropriate supporting evidence and should provide a learning experience for the audience. Authors may refer to CARE guidelines and more specific HOM CASE guidelines to ensure the completeness of their report. The abstract must be structured with a word limit of 250 words, with the following headings: 1. Title 2. Introduction and 3. Case Summary. A case report must be presented only after seeking informed consent from the patient and ensuring anonymity.

Guidelines for Research Studies

Research studies with CTRI registration and Institutional Ethical Committee approval will be given preference. Authors may refer to appropriate guidelines such as CONSORT, SPIRIT or STROBE to ensure completeness of their report. The abstract must be structured with a word limit of 350 and the following headings: 1. Title 2. Introduction 3. Objectives 4. Methodology 5. Results 6. Conclusion. The screening committee's decision will be final in selecting abstracts. The delegates should get appropriate approvals from the concerned authorities if working under any organisation before abstract submission.
